I care about climate change, animal suffering and the condition of people in developing countries. So six months ago I became a **0. vegetarian** or, as a friend puts in, I stopped eating anything with a face or a **0**) **fin** .

It hasn't been easy, and I'm in danger of 1)......but I'm glad I did it and I still believe in all the reasons that persuaded me to say 'no' to meat and fish.

Secondly, I wanted to do my bit to fight global warming. The meat industry is one of the leading sources of the greenhouse gases that has led to global warming. In fact, a United Nations report found that the meat industry produces more greenhouse gasses than all the cars, trains and planes in the world combined. In other words, there's no point in driving fuel-efficient cars and using energy-saving light bulbs if you eat meat every day of your life.

Giving up meat also helps the global poor. 840 million people are still going hungry today, and yet there is more than enough food in the world to feed the entire human population. The problem is that **crops** that could be used to feed the hungry are instead being used to fatten animals 5)...... for food.
